ABOUT ORCA NORWAY

Join the Scuba.com and Orca Norway Crew on an unforgettable 6-day orca expedition in the stunning High Arctic of Norway. This journey offers the unique opportunity to snorkel and freedive with orcas, humpbacks, and occasionally fin or sperm whales, all while exploring Norway's breathtaking fjords.


During your journey, professional chefs will prepare delicious meals, and an experienced crew will ensure your experience is nothing short of magical. The MS Bergsund accommodates 12 guests, primarily in twin cabins. Solo travelers are welcome — many join us each year and leave with lifelong friends.

Northern Norway, particularly the Troms and Finnmark region, is the premier destination for orca watching. From late October to mid-January, this area hosts the world's largest gathering of orcas, drawn by the annual herring migration. Massive schools of herring migrate into the fjords during the winter, attracting orcas that depend on herring as a primary food source. This migration creates a predictable and concentrated area where orcas can be seen hunting and feeding, often alongside humpback whales, with as many as 50-60 orcas observed simultaneously.

We will observe the orcas as they feed and play. Whenever possible, we will jump in the water and swim alongside them. Experiencing these majestic animals in their natural habitat is a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

While the trip focuses on snorkeling and freediving, certified divers with experience in drysuit diving can enjoy evening dives.



Departure Airport: (ALF) Alta Airport

The expedition starts in Alta city, with the most convenient route being a flight to the local airport, Alta airport (ALF), followed by a bus or taxi ride to the city center. If there are no direct flights to Alta from your country, opting for a domestic flight from Oslo airport (OSL) or Tromsö airport (TOS) is usually the best solution.

Airlines flying to Alta Airport:

The pick-up is at 4 pm on Saturday outside the Thon Hotel Alta. You will recognize the crew by their Orcanorway jackets as they welcome you at the pick-up point. A private bus will transport you from the meeting point to the boat's location.

The expedition ends on Friday, with disembarkation between 2 pm and 4 pm. Subsequently, a private bus will return you to Alta city.



Day 1: Welcome in Alta, briefing, dinner, and equipment distribution.

Day 2-5: Daily orca exploration with morning and afternoon outings, onboard meals, and evening activities.

Day 6: Final orca encounters, lunch, and return to Alta.

Dry suits, fins, masks and snorkels are available for rent. Additional Equipment is available for rent or purchase through Scuba.com in NYC pick up before your trip.

For Norway there are two associated plug types, types C and F. Plug type C is the plug which has two round pins and plug type F is the plug which has two round pins with two earth clips on the side. Norway operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz.
